American Kennel Club Rules and Regulations Govern this Specialty Show

PARKING INFORMATION

On October 13, 2009 the San Francisco Bay Area was deluged by the largest wind and rain storm in 50 years. RV's began rolling onto the Alameda County Fairgrounds on October 15. The grounds were soaked and the Fairgrounds asked us not to use most of the grass areas we usually used for parking. We lost 98 parking spaces. Some of you ended up parking a very long way away from where you wanted to be. We sincerely apologize to you for this inconvenience but it was Mother Nature in charge, not us. With a little luck we'll have back all our normal parking spaces.

2011 HARVEST MOON CLASSIC RV PARKING FORM

We ask all exhibitors to be patient with us as we are dealing with new Fairgrounds' on-site rules. We are the only event still permitted to park on the grounds so we are doing our best to make this work for all involved. **All RV parking** is through Gate 12 off Valley Avenue. Make the first right after passing the Watch & Wager Building and follow the signs. Do not proceed to your RV parking space without an escort. \$45 per night for a 20' x 40' space. If your vehicle is larger you must buy two spaces. Reserved Box Van day parking \$35. Unreserved RV overnight parking in large paved parking lot is \$50 per night. Electrical hook-ups not guaranteed. If available in your area you will be charged \$10 additional per night. Del Valle does not make a profit on RV parking; we are simply passing along to you what we are charged. Trailers and tow units may be required to be unhitched. Tagalong vehicles will be parked in a special area. **All vehicles** must have a working fire extinguisher, be self-contained, no discharge of gray water permitted. No electrical cords permitted across paths or roadways. Persons who break open locked boxes or otherwise damage property in order to find electricity will be held responsible for damage and may be asked to leave. No running of generators after 11 p.m. or before 5 a.m. Those wishing to park together must send reservations in together, however there is no guarantee that we can accommodate all requests. **All parking** is at your own risk. Neither the Alameda Co. Fair Assn. or Harvest Moon Classic assumes any responsibility for fire, theft, and/or loss of vehicles or their contents. The Cluster reserves the right to withdraw parking privileges, without return of parking or entry fees, for anyone who cannot abide by these rules or who resorts to abusive language or actions. Violators may be subject to Event Committee charges.

Reserved RV overnight parking hours: Wednesday 2 p.m. to 11 p.m., all other days 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. If your assigned spot is on the show grounds you will have to wait until judging in that area concludes as no moving vehicles permitted past active rings.

There is a \$4.00 per entry fee charge for credit card payments. FAX entries that are received incomplete or unable to read will not be accepted. Make All Checks and Money Orders PAYABLE TO LEA PLAUT. CANADIAN exhibitors must make fees payable in U.S. FUNDS. Please mail checks or money orders with entries. Secretary assumes no responsibility for cash sent through the mail. Tabulate carefully. Due to cost of processing no refunds of \$5.00 and under will be made. There is a \$4.00 fee for any entry cancellations.

A Recording Fee of 50¢ per dog and a Service Fee of \$3.00 per entry, \$3.00 Rally fee will be required for each dog entered at any Licensed or Member Club Show, Obedience Trial, Rally Trial or Tracking Test. These Fees are to be collected by the Show-giving Club and paid to the American Kennel Club. If a dog is entered in more than one class in the show, the Fees are to be collected on the first entry only. (American Kennel Club Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2).

No Entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Entry Fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of Event Committee. If because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entry fee will be made. Extreme weather conditions, such as, but not limited to snow storms, hurricanes, lightning, extreme heat, must be considered for the health and safety of the dogs, exhibitors and spectators. The well-being of dogs, exhibitors and spectators is of paramount importance and, in the event it is necessary to cancel or stop the show before completion, no refund of entry fee will be made.

Post Dated Checks, Returned Checks and Declined Credit Cards, do not constitute a valid entry fee. The Secretaries will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. The returned check or declined credit card MUST BE MADE GOOD by cash or money order BEFORE the dog will be allowed in the ring.

No Refund for Duplicate Entries. This club and its Secretary assume no responsibility for the owner or owner's agents entering a dog in a class in which the dog is not eligible to compete, or for entering the same dog twice.

Errors on Entry Blanks. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors, and no entry fee will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date.

During the hours of judging owners are to be on call, and have their dogs ready for judging. In order that the judging will not be delayed. Dogs need only be present for their judging. Dogs not needed for further judging may be excused. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his dog ready to be shown and at the entrance of the judging ring when the steward calls for the class. Owners of dogs or the handlers of the dogs alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings. It is not the responsibility of the ring steward, nor of any agent of the show giving club to locate any dog, its owner or handler, when the dogs presence is needed in the judging ring. It should be understood by every exhibitor and handler to bring his dog into the ring.

The club, its secretaries or their employees will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any dog exhibited, whether the result of accident or other causes and in addition assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by an exhibitor or handler. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this show is in the care and custody and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show grounds.

Cash Prizes will be paid in the ring to the person showing the dog. Claims for prize money must be made in the ring before the judging of that breed is over, and the Secretaries Office advised at once. The Secretaries and show-giving Club disclaim any liability for cash prizes after the judging of the breed is over.

Trophies and Prizes will be awarded in the judging ring before the completion of judging, any discrepancies must be reported to the Secretary prior to completion of judging. All trophies must be claimed the day of the show. None will be mailed.

Dogs which according to their owners records have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed or Variety Competition, provided this transfer is made by the Secretary at least one half hour prior to the start of the earliest Conformation judging at the Show.

Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class after the closing of entries may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Secretary at least one half hour prior to the scheduled start of the earliest Conformation judging or one half hour prior to the start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show, whichever is earlier.

Please DO NOT LEAVE ANY DOGS IN CLOSED VEHICLES. Do not leave your dogs in unlocked cars. If any dogs are seen to be suffering from extreme temperatures where it is confined without supervision, a California Humane Officer or a Security Officer will be notified to handle the situation. Violators may be reported to the Show Committee for disciplinary action. All persons attending this show hereby waive any claim for damages against the show giving clubs or their members in the event a motor vehicle has to be entered to rescue a dog from overheating or improperly vented conditions. THIS IS A SELF CLEANING SHOW, PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOGS.

The show giving club, the show secretary their agents or employees assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, spectators or to their dogs or property. And further assumes no responsibility for injury to any child not under the control of their parents or guardians.

ENTRIES CLOSE 6 PM PT, WEDNESDAY, September 28, 2011, at the office of the Show Secretary, after which time no entries may be accepted, canceled, changed, substituted, completed or signed, and no entry fees refunded. Telephone and telegraph entries are not accepted. Class changes and cancellations must be received in writing prior to closing date, except as provided for in Chapter 14 Section 6 of the AKC Dog Show Rules.

All entry forms must be signed, and photocopies must include the back with the Agreement; otherwise, the entry cannot be accepted and will be returned.

DIRECTIONS TO THE SHOW

In the Pleasanton area, from Highway 680 north or southbound, take the Bernal Avenue exit. Make a right onto Bernal and then a left onto Valley Avenue. Enter the Fairgrounds through Gate 12. **Be sure to ask the parking attendant for the multi-day parking permit which discounts parking costs a little.**

Clean-up is your Responsibility

Pooper-scoopers (in chlorine filled buckets) will be placed around the grounds and outside all rings. If your dog soils the parking lot, show grounds or ring it is your responsibility to clean it up. By signing the entry form at this show you are agreeing that clean-up is your responsibility. Violators may be subject to an event hearing. Thank you!

Unloading & Parking Information

Unloading is through BOTH the Main Gate off Pleasanton Avenue and Gate 12 off Valley Avenue. Any exhibitor may drive onto the grounds to unload between 6 a.m. and 7:15 a.m. Please leave your headlights on while on the grounds. All vehicles must be off the grounds by 7:30 a.m. or they will be towed. Be sure to allow yourself plenty of time as for obvious safety reasons this time cannot be extended. Except for medical emergencies no vehicles may drive onto the show grounds after 7:15 a.m. You may drive back onto the grounds to load up only after all judging in your area has concluded. After 7:15 a.m. an unloading loop will be open all day between the Young California and Exhibition Buildings (accessed through the main paved parking lot) and through the tunnel in the back for the North Forty rings.

SPECIAL NOTICE ABOUT THE RING AREA

To comply with Fire Marshall regulations and avoid tent congestion at the ring's edge, all canopies must be set back from the ring ropes by a minimum of 10 feet on all sides where they are not already prohibited by the Fire Marshal. Further, a 3-foot aisle on the north (cafeteria) and east (rose garden) sides will be strictly enforced by the show committee. Tent set-backs and aisles will be clearly posted. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Novice Junior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Intermediate Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Senior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Junior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Intermediate Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Senior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Each dog handled in a Junior Showmanship Class must be entered in one of the Breed Obedience Classes at the show, or must be entered for Junior Showmanship only. However, a dog may be substituted. Such substitution must be accompanied by an official AKC entry form. All such substitutions must be made one half-hour prior to the judging of any Junior Showmanship Classes at the show. Each dog must be owned or co-owned by the Junior Handler or by the Junior Handler's father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfather or grandmother, including step and half relations or by a member of the Junior Handler's household. Every dog entered for Junior Showmanship must be eligible to compete in Dog Shows or in Obedience Trials. BITCHES IN SEASON ARE NOT ELIGIBLE. A dog that has been excused or disqualified by a Breed Judge or by a Bench Show Committee may still be handled in Junior Showmanship if eligible to compete in Obedience Trials. A dog that has been rejected, dismissed, or excused by the Veterinarian for the protection of the other dogs at the show or for the protection of the dog excused may not be handled in Junior Showmanship. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition present after the closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Secretary at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of any regular conformation judging or one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show, whichever is earlier. Winning of first place in an Open Class at this show may qualify or count toward qualification for entry in certain future limited Junior Showmanship Classes. For information on eligibility requirements for limited Junior Showmanship Classes which have been approved to date by AKC.

PLEASE NOTE: ALL JUNIOR HANDLERS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE AN AKC NUMBER prior to the day of the event. Numbers may be obtained from the American Kennel Club, call (919) 816-3776.
